Nearly all events are flighted, even less experienced players will be able to win masterpoints against players of their skill level, even if they are not beating up on the experts yet! Third, we have another special treat: a Monday Pro-Am event. The "amateurs" are players with less than 200

masterpoints. The amateurs get to play with an experienced celebrity player. Ken Monzingo, the president of the ACBL, will be one of our celebrity pro players. We also have our customary Charity Pairs game on Monday night. We ask that each of you try to come out and support our charity game. Expert professionals are to give talks/lessons Tuesday thru Saturday. These sessions are free and of great value to players of all skill levels.

The partnership desk will be run by a fine crew. If you have difficulty getting a partner or teammates for team games, by all means stop by the partnership desk. They will help you find a partner/team if one is to be found. As ever, information and handouts regarding other major tournaments in the southwest will be available, as well as some vendor items for sale.

Last, but not least, in addition to the fine amenities at Talking Stick, there are also many wonderful places to visit, dine, and otherwise enjoy in nearby Scottsdale and Phoenix. Bank Error in your favor — collect \$200!

found the following paragraph in Welcome to the North American Bridge Championships by the ACBL.

A primary objective of the ACBL is to instill in all players the concept that vigorous efforts should be made to provide fair play. Every player should strive to make sure the opponents have in no way been harmed through incomplete or misleading information about the meaning of conventional calls and treatments. An aggressive approach along these lines on the part of each and every individual will do much to make sure bridge remains enjoyable to all.

Yes, I want you to turn in your opponents!

If you enter a wrong score that favors your opponents and they ask you to adjust it (to their disadvantage), report them. I want stories about players who practice Active Ethics!

Active Ethics is a term for doing the right thing ... even when it hurts you. They bid three of a major and go down one. You score it as two of a major – making two (+110). They could just accept your score and pretend they did not notice. Instead, they give \$200 back to the bank. That's what you would do ... right? That's Active Ethics! They did not just passively accept your "Bank Error" in their favor; they actively attempted to rectify the situation (give you back your \$200).
