Conventions You Should Play

In your early development, you will be far better off concentrating on your card play — learn how to take tricks. After learning card play you may consider adding conventions to your repertoire. Here are the reasons Brent Manley gives for adding conventions slowly.

1. You need time to grapple with all the nuances of a new convention. Whenever you and your partner decide to add a new convention you should discuss your new weapon thoroughly.

- What if the opponents bid? On the left? On the right?

- At what level is your new convention “off?”

- What does it mean if you don’t use the convention when you could have?

2. You already have a ton of stuff to think about at the table. You must learn to count the opponents’ high-card points and hand shape. How can you manage all this if you also have to remember a dozen conventions you don’t fully comprehend?

3. Certain gadgets are brilliant in concept but not very useful because opportunities to deploy them occur rarely. Keeping everything straight in your head requires mental energy better spent on more mundane — but highly important — tasks such as selecting an opening lead or discovering a way to make (or defeat) a difficult contract. Don’t forget that many conventions use bids that sound so natural that “I forget” is not unusual.

Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell, one of the world’s top pairs, decided to shrink the

size of their system notes. The two have crafted an astoundingly complex bidding system and they almost never have “I forgets.” At one point, Meckstroth appealed to his partner to reduce the agreements because it was getting harder and harder to remember *everything*. If a pair like Meckwell can decide that less is more, it makes sense for aspiring players to follow suit.

I/N Corner Tip 3

Responding to Partner's Takeout Double

What do you do after partner makes a takeout double? As you saw in the last tip, partner promises shortness in the opponent's suit and support for the others. She's asking you to bid, *even with zero points*. In fact, the weaker you are, the more important you bid; otherwise the opponents will make their bid with lots of overtricks. Here are guidelines (HCP = high card points):

- 0-8 HCP: Bid longest suit at cheapest level
- 9-11 HCP: Jump in longest suit (4-card suit is okay, particularly if it's a major suit).
- 12 HCP: cuebid the opponent's suit or bid game if you have a long major suit. (You may not be familiar with cuebids. A simple definition: a bid of the opponent's suit, not to play, but to show a strong hand and force partner to bid.)
- You may bid 1NT with 7-10, good cards in the opponents suit
- You may only pass if you have an extremely good holding in the opponent's suit, such as KQJT9, and expect to beat the contract

Let's put this into practice. Your left-hand opponent opens 1♦ and partner doubles.

LHO Pard RHO You

1♦ Dbl Pass ??

What do you do with each of the following?

- #1. ♠952 ♥8653 ♦Q732 ♣62
- #2. ♠KJ103 ♥98 ♦763 ♣KQ52
- #3. ♠642 ♥K53 ♦QJ108 ♣Q76
- #4. ♠QJ52 ♥AK53 ♦986 ♣K2
- #5. ♠AQJ52 ♥K53 ♦986 ♣K2

Hand 1. Bid 1♥. Partner has asked you to bid, so do it. Passing would be disastrous, and you need 7-10 points to bid 1NT

Hand 2. Jump to 2♠. With a good 9 points, you must tell partner; you might be on for a game. Don't worry that you have only four spades; partner has promised support. Prefer the major suit.

Hand 3. Bid 1NT. You have solid stuff in diamonds, 8 points, and no suit to bid.

Hand 4. Bid 2♦, a cuebid of the opponent's suit. You probably have game in a major suit, but which one? Let partner decide.

Hand 5. Bid 4♠. Partner promises at least 3-card support and an opening hand, so just bid the game.
